On Wednesday, January 9<sup>th</sup>, Lions Mark, Bob V. and Murph accepted an invitation to visit the Easter Seals facility in Villa Park. They were given a complete tour and explanation of their mission by Stephanie Walsh, Resource Development Manager, and their tour guide, Amy. Amy, now 24 and an employee of Easter Seals, has severe disabilities from birth and has been developmentally aided by the organization since she was an infant. She is bright, articulate, knowledgeable and a great ambassador for Easter Seals. Our Lions were very impressed by the depth of the evaluation and therapeutic programs and dedication of the staff. Assistance is available to the general public and is based on ability to pay.

The Audiological Program for assessing hearing impairments was of special interest. Their Board-certified pathologists and audiologists evaluate the severity of hearing impairment and establish a treatment program. This may involve therapy, prescription of special equipment of hearing aids or communications devices and referral for possible surgery or medication.

Our team's consensus was that they are an organization truly worthy of community support. Visit them. They'd love to share their story.
